Michael Cook was born in Puerto Rico and educated in The United Kingdom and the United States. He currently lives in the high country of New Mexico. His nuclear and thermonuclear paintings are one of the earliest concentrated bodies of work in painting that examined the development and use of the atom by conflating the visual language of alchemical notation and particle physics. His interest in the ability of painting pictorial conventions and practice to present essential truths by employing a method of visual semiotics continues to fascinate him. As Kathleen Stewart Howe wrote in her essay on the exhibition *Veneer;* "What are the conditions under which objects become visible in culture? What is the personal and human significance of those visual manifestations? These are questions Cook has pursued in his paintings since the bubble chamber paintings of the late 1970's."
